- Freedom to present to others as our gender of choice
- Freedom to dress as we choose, regardless of gender
- Freedom as an adult to body-altering surgeries
- Freedom to grow and style our hair and/or beard, regardless of sex
- Freedom of speech
- Freedom of religion
- Freedom of assembly and protest
- Right to petition the government
- Right to bear arms
- Freedom from unreasonable searches and seizures
- Right to due process of law
- Freedom from cruel and unusual punishment
- Right to property
- Right to vote
- Right to not be enslaved
- Protection from bullying in school
- Protection from assault and other criminal or tortious behavior
- And many others, guaranteed by constitutional and statutory law!

- The "right" to use public bathrooms, dressing rooms, and showers designated for the opposite sex
- The "right" to prison cells, homeless shelters, hotel rooms, and other spaces designated for the opposite sex

- The "right" to file legal complaints against a business that believes sex is binary and acts accordingly
- The "right" to file legal complaints against an employer who doesn't affirm the validity of an individual's self-proclaimed "gender identity"
